Check out a free Interactive Videoconference (IVC) and Webcast. **IVCs** provide students with unique opportunities to connect with their peers and guest speakers in real time. In these two part sessions available through May, students will learn more about the DRC and Somalia and how they can take a stand against humanitarian crises through the challenge. **Webcasts** are

60-minute live-streaming events that allow students to learn more about humanitarian crises from a panel of guest speakers and peers.
